It is a joy to be able to offer Mass publicly once more. However, to keep everyone safe parishioners will have to **sign in** to a weekday Mass as they arrive. **On a weekend there will be a booking system.**

From next weekend there will be Mass in the churches. As a result of the virus, entrance will be limited to those who **book online** for the weekend Masses. Numbers are limited. You will be able to reserve your place from midweek via our website. **If you do not have the chance to book online, please phone me and I will try to reserve you a place.** As tickets are limited, not everyone who would want to go to Mass next weekend is likely to be able to attend.

The times of the weekend Masses have changed. This is to facilitate the booking system and to provide people with a more convenient time. It will make it easier for me to be 'on the door' for the Masses and especially whilst the reservation system is in place. The new times will not be easy for everyone but it would have to be said I heard a number of people saying the times of Masses before were not easy for many people. I have no doubt that many will have views on this and I will do my best to listen and respond to the needs of the parishes.

We have to comply with a whole raft of Health and Safety regulations - and be seen to do so. The churches will look a little different and two volunteers will be on hand at all times to make sure that everyone is safe. Thank you for those who have volunteered. The more the merrier.
