**Sacramental Preparation:** Soon we can celebrate the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist in our parishes once more. Receiving the Eucharist is central to our Christian lives, the very heart of our faith and worship. Children who come regularly and consistently to mass will be invited to make their First Holy Communion this July. Participating in the Mass helps us all better understand the power of God's love for us.

It is still uncertain whether all the restrictions we are living under will be lifted until the end of July. Let us assume that families will have to stay in their benches and the Eucharist will be brought to where people are. **It is hoped that the children will be able to make their First Communion at the Mass they normally attend.** It does mean that the whole parish community can celebrate with you. I suggest the children sit with their families and receive along with them. A family photo could be taken after Mass. You might wish to invite one or two family members or friends. However, we will still have to reserve a place in church and I would ask everyone to be sensible about how many people they can reserve a place for. Please speak to Fr. Jonathan about arranging the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) before First Communion.
