Twenty Five Years of Priesthood. Celebrating the Silver Jubilee 20th July 1996 -

A quarter of a century ago many of you joined me in celebrating my ordination as priest for the Diocese of Leeds. It was life changing moment for me - a new beginning serving in various parishes near and far. On that scorching July 20th, Bishop Konstant presided at the Ordination Mass in a packed Saint Paulinus with fulsome singing, a beautiful solo or two from the rafters and great joy. Friends from Kenya and my family were in attendance and it felt a special moment in my faith journey and indeed for many who were present that day. If you were there, thank you for the welcome you gave when I was received into the presbyterate. We endeavour to support each other every day.

After the Mass, my brother Nicholas breathed life into the family bag pipes and played some rousing tunes as we processed to Saint Paulinus Parochial Hall for a wonderful spread, with the bar open and a bit of dancing. Would that we could do the same to celebrate the jubilee. It may be some time before we can hold an event like the one in 1996.

For the weekend Masses of 24th and 25th July we should be able to return to singing in church and praising the Lord from our pews. The Gospel of that weekend is the Feeding of the Five Thousand. Whilst we may not be able to use the parish halls for a such a feast or social gathering we can donate to others who feed people practically and spiritually. Some people have prompted me to mark the occasion of the jubilee. Therefore I propose the following. Let us collect for <u>Missio</u>, which has an international outreach and our own <u>Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVP)</u> group working in our community.



Missio is the Pontifical Missionary Society. Many of us have a red box. The money that we collect is used worldwide. A proportion is used to help fund seminarians and religious novices through their long years of study. Our donations are providing for sisters and priests in very often remote corners of the world. By their active ministry, they bring God's love

into the lives of the poor around the world.

The Saint Vincent de Paul Society is also International. Our SVP group is of lay faithful who quietly go about caring for our own needy. By visiting and ringing, providing help for people young and old to get a break or a breather, the Saint Vincent de Paul Society makes a significant and positive difference in our town. It is a group which deserves our support and new members. It seems a fitting way to celebrate the Silver Jubilee of Priesthood & supporting parish volunteers.
